Although we are only 3 weeks into the term lots has been happening. Tess our therapy dog has arrived, we have had swim school for some of the junior classes and term 3 programs are well under way. Also, we have had some painting and kitchen renovation over the holidays which were much needed and some new IT equipment and standing frames delivered.

My thanks to the families who came to the Athletics Carnival in Education Week. A great time was had by all and even the sun shone (perhaps a little too much for parents sat out in it). One of our junior classes visited St Cecilia's School and were made most welcome by all the students and staff. We have enjoyed our usual visit by SHORE boys on Mondays and a special visit by boys from St Ignatius on St Ignatius Day, July 31st.

Term 3 is a time for "heads down" for work for all with a focus on students completing their program targets. Staff will have their reviews by their supervisors this term and discuss their own professional development which will assist them in their classroom work.

Notices will be coming out soon about a special P & C meeting where staff from ADAHC will talk about their services and potential effects of the Disability Care program. We will also have a visit from a special Behavioural Ophthalmologist this term to talk with us about research in this area with children with disabilities. More on that and potential services in coming Newsletters.

Finally, our thanks go to QBE Insurance for a special grant of \$10,000. Through a contact from the Warringah Orchid Society we were given the opportunity to apply for a grant to pay for a Music Therapist. We were

Therapy Dog - Tess

We were thrilled to be contacted by the Guide Dog Association during the school holidays to take ownership of a 'Pets As Therapy' female Labrador called Tess. It meant that during the holidays Ruth Rogers (her designated 'owner' on behalf of the school) got to know her before introducing her to the children on the first day back in Term 3.

Tess has come to Fisher Road School as a 21 month old pedigree yellow Labrador. She was born in October 2011 and was destined to be a Guide Dog for a blind or visually impaired person. At around 11 months she went to the puppy school to be trained, but after 3 months was deemed to be too exuberant on meeting other people or other dogs. It was hoped that with time she would settle but at her second stint at the Guide Dog Puppy Training School she was 'recalled' to be a therapy dog.

Classes at the school will engage with Tess in different ways. Some will take her for walks (on-site and off-site), some will groom her, some will play with her, and some will simply have her in the room moving around the children. Class teachers will gauge what engagement is appropriate for each class, and of course each student.

At our Sports Carnival Tess represented the school in her new school top. She joined in a race with a reluctant senior student, and licked the face of a fallen competitor (Liam) to make him happy. It was a special moment!

Crunch & Sip Program

Crunch & Sip is a school program that gets children eating vegetables and fruit and drinking water in the classroom. It encourages children to choose vegetables and fruit as the first choice for a snack and water as a thirst quencher. As well as providing vital nutrition for students, "refueling" with these healthy options assists children's performance in the classroom. Healthy eating behaviours are modeled in the classroom and reinforce the nutrition messages in the PD/H/PE curriculum. By making fruit and vegetable eating and water drinking normal in the classroom, healthy habits can be formed and continued into adolescence and adulthood. Fisher Road School will be implementing Crunch & Sip into all classes during term three. A leaflet outlining what to pack into your child's lunch box during Crunch & Sip as well as what is NOT allowed will be sent home shortly.

M&M slice Ingredients

125g butter (melted)

1 tin (395g) sweetened condensed milk
250 g Marie biscuits (crushed)
