This week we received delivery and installation of 3 new interactive whiteboards (IWBs). As you know every

class here at Fisher Road School has an interactive whiteboard, a teaching tool that supports learning. As our IWBs across the school are slowly requiring repair many of them are being deemed non-replaceable. Early this term we were fortunate to be able use our school Deductible Gift Recipient fund to purchase 3 new IWBs for a discounted price. This week Class NS, Class RP and Class SB all watched in excitement as their new boards were installed. This piece of technology allows our students to utilise all of the skills that they are working towards mastering within their personalised learning plans (PLPs). Students practice turn taking, cause and effect response, **mun** listening, following directions. waiting. choice making and social interactions through this highly valuable teaching resource. Thank you to the P&C for your support in the school's purchase of this valuable technology. 
The third group of volunteers put together some new flat pack furniture for the office and library to help modernise these areas of the school.

Every Friday we have a 'fruit appreciation' session. During this time we talk about fruit; its colour, shape and any particular characteristics such as strawberries with the seeds on the outside. We peel and/or cut the fruit, sometimes we use an apple corer to make a hole in an apple for the students to look through or a thick straw to remove the centre pieces of a strawberry. We sometimes place different pieces of fruit on a wooden skewer and have students replicate the pattern.





The students touch and smell the fruit and even reluctant eaters of fruit have been tempted to taste. This sensory session provides our students with many op-



portunities and everyone enjoyed last week when we incorporated some creative art by making a palm tree using banana, mandarin and kiwi fruit .




praise for the progress that they have made in bike riding over the year. Great work!


Class SH



of Class TH.






Class JK
