
Welcome back and to our Fisher Road students, families and to our new students and their families

Working with Externally Funded Service Providers

Fisher Road School has updated school procedures to comply with the Department of Education guide-lines 'Working with Externally Funded Service Providers'.


All documentation is available to download from the school website and includes an explanation flowchart of the entire process, Parent/Carer Request, Provider Agreement, WWCC Appendix 11.

The school is also finalising 'Working together at Fisher Road School', a document that will outline the aim of working together to enhance individual student learning and define roles and responsibilities of our staff, parent/carers and therapists whilst engaged in the provision of therapy support.

The teachers at school are all aware of this process and are available to discuss this provision with you if you are considering applying.

For any requests to be considered for approval, the provision of therapy must integrate with the delivery of curriculum and educational supports as part of reasonable adjustment for the student, taking account of the operational requirements and education objectives and priorities of the school.

If this is a consideration please speak with your child's teacher.


Class VR

School messages

Sun Safety for Children

Thank you for working with us to keep our students sun safe. There has been an increase in the number of students who attend school with a hat in their bag which is fabulous!

Please ensure that 4hour water resistant sunscreen is provided if you would like the staff to support your child to re-apply this throughout the day. We ask that you apply sunscreen in the morning as needed.

The staff have looked at the UV chart and have sun safe strategies in place including supporting students to move into the shade, change of play locations (where there is more shade options), opening classrooms with air conditioning and a movie on the days with extreme heat conditions and reminding students to drink water and keep cool.

Please speak with your child's teacher regarding this matter if required.

We encourage students to drink water before and after every break.



Class Dojo trial

teachers, SLSO'S, parents and students. Class Dojo is being used at Fisher Road School to track student rewards in Positive Behaviour For Learning (PBL). When a student receives an instant PBL reward from the PBL reward choice box, they are given a DOJO point under a PBL expectation of I Care, I Learn & I Respect. Students can also count or award their own PBL points through the interactive white board.

Each student also has a story that can be used to share updates, photos and videos with just the students' parents or carers. This positive form of communication is a fun way to engage the

Class DOJO is a classroom school community and receive real time feedback.

> A class report can also share useful information from the teacher about class programs or daily announcements with all parents and carers who are linked to a class.

> The Class DOJO app also has a toolkit with fantastic resources such as a timer, date and music.

Parents and carers can join the class story by following a link in an email invite sent by the teacher or an access code sent home in a letter.

We would love to hear what you think of this new form of communication between home and school.




Class SB

Post School Parents Information Night


7pm, Wednesday, March 14th
