If the office is unattended there is a bell on the front counter. These procedures are in place for the safety and well-being of our students and staff.



Our class is pleased to have everyone back. Last week we were all together for morning circle the first time in more than a month. It was nice to see everyone actively participate in the activity such as following simple instructions like passing an item to the person next to them or choosing a sensory item from a container. We were also trialing the use of Objects of Reference in setting up our timetable and so far, there has been some positive response. From May 27 to June 3 is National Reconciliation Week. We have been immersing ourselves with activities that involve painting using specific colors and reading books and listening to songs on Aboriginal culture. During Covid-19 we have been utilizing the school oval instead of going to community parks. #### **National Reconciliation Week 2020**

On this journey, Australians are all In This Together; every one of us has a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories and cultures. At Fisher Road School students are engaged in everyday activities that acknowledge Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples across Key Learning Areas. Students have been decorating designs of native animals in colourful patterns, listening to sensory stories about Aboriginal culture, participating in the Yarning Circle and communicating with each other.

Students are very enthusiatic about the community project at the front of the school. So far, we have learnt about the Dreamtime story of the Rainbow Serpent who created the valleys and river beds and Tiddalick the Frog who brought the floods to fill the streams and rivers. Aunty Caroline Glass-Pattison is our cultural mentor and is advising us on our designs for the front of the school including a Welcome Wall. Students have experimented with using underglazes on ceramic tiles to paint their designs. We look forward to seeing more of the artwork.













## **CLASS NS**




# **CLASS FR**


# **CLASS TH**


#### **CLASS SB**

#### **CLASS JK**




Class JK are all so happy to be back at school and were all excited to see their friends again. Over the last few weeks we have been trying to stick to our regular routines where it was possible. We have been unable to see our music therapist so the class has really enjoyed the music therapy sessions that Anita has put up onto google classrooms. The children were very excited to see her and to play along on instruments. We have also been doing a lot of Tacpac sessions. It is a big hit in our class and it helps the students to regain focus and to regulate their senses. Heath and Rafaela particularly enjoy this program. We look forward to returning to most of our class programs and are very excited to have the class JK gang back together!



At the term 2 Staff Development Day, Teachers were engaged in professional learning about Teaching Sprints, a new way for teachers to be involved in improvement practice. Building quality teachers has a positive impact on student learning outcomes. The focus for Term 2 is Explicit Teaching and Direct Instruction. Teachers have been working in class groups and reading articles about evidence based practice that will be implemented over a four week Teaching Sprint. Teachers will evaluate their teaching practice and develop strategies that improve results in student achievement.

Also, In staff meetings we have been highlighting a best practice strategy known as Wait Time which allows students time to think and process a request. In inclusive Education, it is suggested that there should be 10 seconds Wait Time between asking a question and receiving a response. For Life Skills activities, the Wait Time can be up to 1 - 2 minutes and longer for higher order thinking and cognitive processing. The staff are very interested at seeing the results of this evidence based practice. I have also been meeting with individual teachers to work together on planning teaching strategies, programming and learning goals. It will be a fantastic opportunity to CoTeach in classrooms and focus on particular strategies in learning for student achievement. We have been developing resources in Video Modelling which is a strategy that provides short videos of expected behaviours such as working together in a group and playing nicely in the sand pit. As students watch the Video Model, they learn positive behaviours.










How to sign the word TISSUE: Start with pointer finger hooked and thumb extended on either side of nose bring hand down closing thumb and pointer into fist.
