

During Science this term Class KA have been exploring our Solar System.

Each week we are learning about the features of each planet such as how big they are, what their surface is like, how hot/cold they are and how long they take to orbit around the Sun.

Did you know that if the Sun was the size of a basketball, our planet Earth is only as big as a pinhead?

The students help create an information poster about each planet with PECs symbols and are creating their own scrapbook.

Using different techniques each week, the students have also enjoyed creating artworks representing each planet.

We look forward to exploring more of our Solar System this Semester.



CLASS KF & MT



Classes KF and MT have been busy in our school garden this term. We are very excited to be working in partnership with an organization called PlantingSeeds. PlantingSeeds has created a habitat regeneration program, to support biodiversity and encourage sustainability within our ecosystem. At school we are supporting the regeneration of habitats - by establishing key pollinating spaces and pollinator habitats in and around our school garden

The B&B's (Bed and Breakfasts for Birds, Bees, Butterflies and Biodiversity), provide much needed rest and revival for pollinators who are experiencing alarming population declines. Each Bed and Breakfast includes a selection of native pollinating plants and a pollinator habitat. This habitat at our school includes a native stingless bee hive and an insect hotel.

Our students have taken data on the number of different species of insects we have in our school garden. In the coming weeks we will be planting more native plants pollinating plants. We will then redo our data collection to see if we have attracted more pollinators to our garden.

We created a theme board in the classroom to display the artwork we have created around summer and the beach. Using various sensory and art materials we have made lentil starfish, cardboard turtles, coloured fish, jellyfish and a sandy beach with various shells. Kanga, Celine and Mia enjoyed painting, pasting and gluing and Luca has enjoyed touching the different materials used. They have all enjoyed reading books, sorting visuals of summer and winter items and watching short clips about the different animals. We look forward to continuing our seasons theme throughout the year.

We have been making some fabulous work around the theme of Jungle Animals with connections to Key Learning Areas in the NESA curriculum. Our wonderful jungle decorations have inspired us to make Hippos in Visual Arts. We used cardboard rolls, grey paper, and hippo faces that we individualised with pencils drawings. We enjoyed shared sensory reading including **Jungle Drums by Graeme Base** and Giraffes Can't Dance by Giles Andres. We continued our learning about jungle animals and watched a video called All **About Hippos. We learnt** Hippos have a big mouth, large teeth and thick skin. We love **Hippos!**

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
